*EMST is the abbreviation for Enhanced Mental Skills Test.. This screening test can be done on the phone or in person and is effective in identifying the earliest stage of cognitive decline, known as Mild Cognitive Impairment. It is very probable that the impairment will not necessarily be apparent to the agent. This test is age/gender/education specific with no one single cut-off score like the current Delayed Word Recall.

Q & A:

Question:	What does the acronym 'APS' recorded in the Underwriting requirement mean?
Answer:	The definition of 'APS' (Attending Physician's Statement) is the applicant has available medical records from the last 3 years from a medical physician licensed in the United States.
Question:	Is an Independent Medical Exam (IME) an acceptable replacement for medical records?
Answer:	No, the information that may be presented in a medical exam is insufficient for underwriting purposes, therefore, we do not offer coverage based on a one-time exam.
Question:	Are medical records from physicians in other countries acceptable for Underwriting?
Answer:	No. For any benefit amount or medical condition that requires an APS, this means the Underwriting Department needs the last 3 years of medical records from a physician in the United States.
Question:	Does MedAmerica insure Christian Scientists?
Answer:	Yes, we do not discriminate against any religion. Regarding Christian Scientists, however, if the applicant meets the Underwriting guidelines without the required APS, he or she would be issued coverage. If an APS is required based on the Underwriting guidelines, it is unlikely the applicant would be eligible to apply given that by virtue of their religion, the individual would not receive medical attention from a physician licensed in the United States. Subsequently the underwriting requirement of APS would not be met. An Independent Medical Exam IS NOT an acceptable alternative, as discussed previously.

Height-Weight-Body Mass Index

If the applicant's weight does not fall within the range noted below, they are NOT ELIGIBLE TO APPLY.

Underweight = < 19.0

Normal weight = 19-24.9

Overweight = 25-29.9
